


Getting to Stewart Island is an experience in itself - keep an eye out for wildlife including seals, dolphins and seabirds.

Readily accessible by ferry from Bluff (1 hour) and small plane from Invercargill (20 mins). Both options have several departures daily. Coach transfers connect with the ferries from Invercargill (all year) and Queenstown / Te Anau (Nov - Apr). On arrival at the flight depot or ferry terminal you will be transferred to the Lodge.

The Lodge

Located just five minutes walk from the village centre up on a hill, the Lodge is private and secluded with commanding views across Halfmoon Bay and Foveaux Strait.

The Lodge has extensive grounds, home to many native birds, including kaka (native parrots), which may be viewed from the terrace. In the evening, the guest lounge or outdoor terrace provides the perfect place to relax. Restaurants are available in the village for evening dining. A small kitchen is also available for guest use. Each morning a continental breakfast is served in the dining room. Free WIFI is available.

Activities

Stewart Island is a haven for nature lovers, walkers and outdoor adventurers.



Most of the island is protected within Rakiura National Park, making it a natural refuge for native birds and plants.

The small village Oban has a general store, small museum as well as craft shops, cafés and restaurants. Activities available on the island include: guided and independent walks, Ulva Island Explorer cruises to Ulva Island wildlife sanctuary, fishing, small coach tours, sea kayaking, kiwi encounters, bird watching and exploring the coastline by rental car, motor scooter or mountain bike.
